FACILITY

The Citadel Theatre complex covers a full city block in downtown Edmonton. The area has been designated the Arts District and in addition to our theatre complex, there is a public library, an art gallery, historical museum, and a concert hall. The Citadel has five theatres, each designed for different audiences:

The **Shoctor Theatre** has a proscenium stage with 630 seats and is one of the mainstages for the subscription season;

The **Maclab Theatre** has a stunning thrust stage and 685 seats. It is also a mainstage venue;

The **Rice Theatre** at the Citadel, a beautiful cabaret and black box theatre with flexible seating up to 150;

Zeidler Hall is an auditorium with 240 seats. Also used as a small movie theatre;

The Tucker Amphitheatre is a 150-seat thrust stage in the Lee Pavilion (our plant-filled conservatory). Used for special events like weddings and receptions.

In addition to the performance spaces, we have:

- Shoctor Rehearsal Hall (2nd floor), our main rehearsal hall, adjacent to the Shoctor Theatre;
- "The Bentleys": Multipurpose rooms that are used for rehearsals, auditions, meetings and fittings (3rd floor);
- Foote Theatre School with a separate entrance to three spacious classrooms (2nd floor). The Citadel offers a wide variety of classes for ages 3 and up.
- Production offices and shops for props, scenic carpentry, wardrobe and administration (2nd & 3rd floor);
- The Lee Pavilion.

The Shoctor, The Maclab and The Rice each have their own green room, and a cluster of dressing rooms.

The Citadel Theatre is wheelchair accessible, however we recognize that there may be barriers. We are working on a series of videos for highlighting our space for all building users and encourage artists to reach out in advance to Producer Jessie van Rijn (jvanrijn@citadeltheatre.com) for a custom video.

PROCEDURES

GETTING PAID (ARTISTS ON CONTRACT WITH CITADEL THEATRE)

WEEKLY PAY CHEQUES

Our Company Manager arranges with the Payroll Accountant to have pay cheques and statements of direct deposit prepared weekly and given to the Stage Manager on Thursday afternoon. If you have any concerns about your cheque, the Company Manager will be happy to assist you.

DIRECT DEPOSIT

If you'd like to take advantage of the safe and efficient method of direct deposit for your weekly pay, contact our Company Manager. If you have been paid before at the Citadel by direct deposit, this method will continue unless you give us written instructions to change to payment by cheque.

TAXES

T4 and T4A slips will be mailed to your permanent address at income tax time (on or before February 28 of the next year). Please ensure that the Payroll Department has your correct mailing address.

MAKING CONTACT WITH THE OUTSIDE WORLD

MAIL

Mail, phone messages, or packages received on your behalf will be forwarded to your Stage Management team. <u>Please note:</u> Citadel Theatre is a registered charity; all mail received is opened by Reception in the presence of two staff members. If you would like to have mail or packages (Amazon, from family, etc) sent to the theatre and have it remain unopened, please ensure all correspondence is sent to:

Daily mail delivery usually arrives around 10:00 a.m. Company mail is usually put into the Stage Manager's mailbox by 11:00 a.m. Please note: Any packages originating from the US are subject to brokerage fees, which will be charged back to you. It is best to order from a Canadian company whenever possible (via Canadian websites).

Need stamps? The nearest post office is located in Shoppers Drug Mart (in City Centre Mall, northwest of Citadel Theatre).

If you'd like to use our courier service, you will have to pay in advance (credit card is best) – please see our Company Manager to coordinate.

PHONE/FAX

If you need to make a landline call within the building or send a fax, please see your Stage Manager or our Company Manager.

STAYING INFORMED AND SAFE AT THE CITADEL

COVID-19 PROTOCOL

Each company on contract at Citadel Theatre may be given a specific COVID-19 PROTOCOL package prior to rehearsals beginning. Please ask Producer Jessie van Rijn (jvanrijn@citadeltheatre.com) if you have any questions about Citadel Theatre's COVID-19 Protocols.

CALL BOARDS

The call boards located in or near Green Rooms and rehearsal spaces are reserved for official company information such as rehearsal and performance calls, Equity correspondence, and invitations for the company.

EMERGENCIES

Your Stage Manager will take you through emergency protocols on your first day. Fire alarm and evacuation procedure, as well as first aid kit and AED locations, will be part of these activities. A member of Citadel's Production team will discuss additional emergency procedures on your first day onstage.

SECURITY & BUILDING ACCESS

Parts of the Citadel Theatre complex are accessible to the public. For that reason, we have many doors that have codes, which your Stage Manager will supply you with (Administration office, Shoctor Backstage and Maclab Backstage). Since the Citadel Theatre is partly accessible to the public, we strongly recommend caution with your personal belongings. Whenever possible, lock your belongings in your dressing room or give them to your Stage Manager. At no time should doors be propped open – please ensure any auto-lock doors close behind you. Please report any suspicious activity to your Stage Manager, Security, or a Citadel Theatre staff person. Should you require access to a locked space outside of show or rehearsal times (for example: you left your wallet in your dressing room and the door is locked) or you require immediate assistance, call **ACM Security:** 780-860-9447

GENERAL POLICIES

SMOKING/VAPING

Smoking and vaping are not permitted in the Citadel Theatre (City of Edmonton Bylaw 6177). Please note that a city bylaw covers all parts of the theatre complex (including exterior within 10m of all doors) and is in effect 24 hours a day.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

The consumption of alcohol on Theatre premises, other than at Citadel-related functions such as receptions and opening nights, is not permitted and offenders will be subject to disciplinary action. Anyone consuming alcohol at a Citadel-related function is encouraged to drink responsibly. The use of marijuana or illegal drugs on Theatre premises is not permitted and offenders will be subject to disciplinary action. Any employee reporting for work while under the influence of illegal drugs, alcohol or marijuana will be barred from the premises and subject to disciplinary action.

SCENTED PRODUCTS

Citadel Theatre is a scent-free workplace. We ask that you refrain from wearing perfume, cologne or other scented products (soap, hairspray, creams, aftershave) while working at the Citadel Theatre. Please talk to your Stage Manager for additional information.

BACKSTAGE VISTORS

For the health and safety of all staff, artists and crew, only Citadel staff and those involved in Citadel productions may enter the backstage area. Please do not invite guests backstage after a performance. Guests are welcome to wait for you in the lobby.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH & EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Luc Tellier, our Director of Education & Outreach, may have opportunities for you and fellow company members to participate in during your time at the Citadel. These opportunities can include Talkbacks or other informal "chats" with members of the public (all ages). Your Company will be contacted, as requests come up, to see if you are interested. Agreeing to these requests is strictly optional.

POST-PRODUCTION EXIT SURVEY

The Citadel Theatre is committed to providing a welcoming and safe place for artists to take creative risks. Part of that is ensuring that all our artists are given opportunity to share their experience, in hopes that the team at The Citadel Theatre can continue to grow, shift understanding, and challenge our own expectations. Immediately following the close of a production, Citadel Theatre will send an online survey that allows for you to share your thoughts, concerns or ideas with our Artistic Administration team and Senior Leadership – these responses can be completely anonymous, or you can include your name.

CHILD ACTOR(S) IN COMPANY (if applicable)

Section 59 of the CTA spells out the theatre's responsibility for the care and treatment of young actors until the age of 16. Additionally, the Citadel Theatre has developed our own policy and procedures for the special circumstances that arise when children are in the company. We post a copy of Section 59 and our policy on the callboard whenever there are children in an acting company. Youth actors have been instructed to stay out of the dressing rooms of the adult company members, unless so assigned. If you have any questions about the presence of child(ren) in your company, please talk to your Stage Manager or our Company Manager.

COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS

Designers, directors, actors and stage managers are offered the following for the production on which they work:

- 2 Press Night tickets: a Citadel staff person will send an invitation email about 3 weeks before the opening performance offering tickets for your show. Press Night tickets must be pre-booked and can only be picked up at the Box Office about an hour before the performance and are held under your name. **Please only ask for press night tickets if you are sure they will be use.
- A maximum of 2 tickets (subject to availability) for any performance (excluding press night and the final week of the run):: These are booked by going to the Box Office and telling the staff that you are a Company member of "Show Title". Your name will be on the company list for your show. These tickets can be picked up by your guest up to an hour before the performance and are held under your name. Tickets must be booked at least 48 hours in advance of desired performance. All comps will be booked at back of house at the time of the booking request. On the day of the performance, comps will be assigned into best available seats (subject to availability).
- 2 Half-Price tickets (excluding press night and the final week of the run): Go to the box office and tell the staff that you are a Company member. Your name will be on the company list for your show. These tickets should be paid at time of booking and can be picked up by your guest up to an hour before the performance and are held under your name.

You may also have an opportunity to see other Citadel Mainstage productions that may be running during your time of residency. Each company member is able to access 1 complementary ticket (based on availability). These are booked by going to the Box Office and telling the staff that you are a Company member of "Show Title." Your name will be on the company list for your show.

INDUSTRY PASS/ "EQUITY RATE"

As an artist at the Citadel Theatre, you are eligible to purchase an Industry Pass for the current season for \$20 + GST. This pass allows you to purchase \$20-25 + GST tickets to any Citadel Theatre production during that season, and discounted tickets to other events (some restrictions apply). Industry Pass Holders can purchase ONE ticket at the Industry Pass price per production (additional tickets are at regular price.) The Industry Pass discount is only valid for the first two weeks of a run. The Industry Pass tickets are available starting 10 days prior to the first

performance. Additional benefits for pass holders are available at partner Edmonton Theatre Companies (so you can see other shows during your rehearsal period in Edmonton). Please contact the Box Office for more information, or to purchase: boxoffice@citadeltheatre.com / 780-425-1820.

The Industry Pass is an affordable option for other theatre colleagues to see your show for approx. \$45.00 + GST\$ (for pass, show ticket, and fee). This is our "Equity Rate." They can then see other shows for $$^25 + GST$$ in our season, or in our community at a discounted rate!



VIOLENCE, WORKPLACE AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICIES

The Citadel Theatre endeavours to provide a safe, respectful, and healthy environment for those working on its premises, its patrons, and third-party contractors.

Violence, bullying, and workplace and/or sexual harassment will not be tolerated.

Citadel Theatre is a proactive participant in **CAEA** and **PACT's** Not In Our Space Program. As such, we will present an anti-harassment statement on the first day of rehearsal. We will offer ways to support artists when there is a question about harassment in their workspace or when steps need to be taken to resolve an incident. Citadel Theatre wants to ensure your voice is heard and has multiple reporting options (please use the one that best suits you and the situation): If you have any questions about these policies or need to talk, please reach out to your Stage Manager, the production's CAEA Deputy, the Director, our Company Manager Peni Christopher, our Artistic Director Daryl Cloran, our Interim Executive Director Alan Nursall, our Board President Jennifer Addison, our HR Generalist Kayla van Sterren or through Canadian Actors' Equity Association's HAVEN Helpline (1-855-201-7823, https://www.caea.com/Features/Haven-Helpline).

SAFE DISCLOSURE PROCESS

Citadel Theatre is committed to providing a safe, neutral, and confidential space for anyone wanting to bring information forward.

We encourage you to reach out through Citadel Theatre's third-party Safe Disclosure Process if you have concerns that you do not feel comfortable sharing with anyone related to the production or Citadel Theatre.

The program will offer e-mail as a first point of contact with the option for a follow up conversation or meeting with a disclosure advisor. Participants will be given the option of meeting with a male or female advisor. This program is being managed through Wade King, a Rights, Equity and Safe Disclosure Specialist.

No identifiable information will be forwarded unless specifically requested by you. The safe disclosure process will be reviewed with you in detail upon making a report. Information about resources and/or supports can be made available during the process as well.

The Citadel Theatre Disclosure Program facilitates reports of wrongdoing and ensures that there is a safe space for the "Citadel Community" to come forward to share concerns related to their employment or

experiences with Citadel Theatre. Users can expect a reporter-led, trauma-informed process that enables them to share their experience, understand their options (if any) for resolution and access resources.

DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEE

In this policy "employee" is defined as a person who is in the employ of the Citadel Theatre in the position of a wage earner, contractor or volunteer. Contractor includes all persons who have entered in a contract with the theatre and includes, but is not limited to, actors, designers, technicians, stage management, teachers, and rental clients.

DEFINITION OF VIOLENCE

"Violence" is defined as the threatened, attempted, or actual conduct of a person that causes or is likely to cause physical injury. Acts of violence within the Citadel Theatre are unacceptable whether committed by an employee against another employee or a member of the public or by a member of the public against any employee. The Citadel Theatre believes in the prevention of violence and promotes a violence-free workplace in which all people respect one another and work together to achieve common goals. The management of the Citadel Theatre is committed to investigating reported incidents of violence in an objective and timely manner, taking necessary action and providing appropriate support for victims.

DEFINITIONS OF WORKPLACE AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Workplace harassment includes objectionable conduct, which may create an intimidating, offensive, or hostile work environment such that an employee's work performance is adversely affected, or that interferes and undermines an individual's employment relationship or that denies an individual the respect and dignity they deserve. It includes any behaviour which is known, or which should be reasonably known, to be unwelcome.

Workplace harassment may include:

- Written or verbal abuse or threat;
- Unwelcome remarks, jokes, innuendos, taunting or degrading comments about a person's race, religious beliefs, colour, gender, gender identity, gender expression, physical disability, mental disability, age, ancestry, place of origin, marital status, source of income, family status or sexual orientation of that person;
- Displays of racist or other offensive or derogatory pictures;
- Name calling, racial or ethnic slurs;
- Practical jokes, pranks or mischievous conduct which may cause awkwardness or embarrassment.

Sexual harassment includes unwanted sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favours, and other unwanted verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature which might reasonably be perceived as placing a condition of a sexual nature on new or continued employment, work assignment, or on any opportunity for training, development or advancement.

Sexual harassment may include:

- Unwelcome sexual remarks, jokes, innuendos or taunting regarding a person's appearance, body, attire, age or marital status;
- A sexual advance or solicitation made by an individual who is in a position to grant or deny benefit or advancement;
- Expressed or implied promise of reward for complying with a sexual oriented request or actual or threatened reprisals against an individual who has rejected a sexual advance;
- Unwanted sexual attention of an abusive or persistent nature, or intimidating invitations or requests with sexual overtones, whether expressed or implied;
- Comments unduly emphasizing gender;

- Unwanted physical advances and contact such as touching, patting or pinching, or leering or other gestures of a sexual nature;
- Unwelcome displays of pornographic, derogatory or offensive pictures, materials or graffiti of a sexual nature.

Sexual harassment may occur between any two or more people. The behaviour need not be intentional in order to be considered sexual harassment. Sexual harassment is illegal under the provisions of the Alberta Human Rights Act.

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT WORKPLACE AND/OR SEXUAL HARASSMENT?

If you feel you are being harassed:

- 1. Tell the alleged offender (with a witness present) that the harassing behaviour is unwelcome and unacceptable and must be stopped.
- 2. Keep a written record of incidents, dates, times, locations, possible witnesses and your response to the harassment. You do not have to have a record to make a complaint, but a record can strengthen your case and help you remember details over time.
- 3. If the behaviour continues, make a complaint by reporting the situation to the Company Manager, Executive Director, the Artistic Director, the Chair of the Board of Directors, or your Union Representative (CAEA Deputy). Although it is our desire to address these matters expediently and at the earliest opportunity possible, if you do not feel comfortable approaching any of the persons above, you are not required to address them in the order provided and at all times may avail yourself of whatever remedies are otherwise available to you. In making a complaint, you should establish:
 - a) Who the alleged offender is and a description of the offensive behaviour
 - b) When the incident(s) took place
 - c) The surrounding circumstances
 - d) Other people, including witnesses, who may assist in defining the incident.
 - e) When you told the alleged offender that the behaviour must be stopped, and the name of the witness(es) present.

DEALING WITH A COMPLAINT

- 1. Once a complaint is received it will be kept strictly confidential insofar as legally possible. An investigation will be undertaken in an expedient fashion, and necessary steps taken to resolve the problem. If a complaint is filed through a union as a grievance, a meeting will be held with the union representative before and after the investigation.
- 2. Both the complainant and the alleged harasser will be interviewed, as well as any individuals who may be able to provide relevant information. All information will be kept in confidence.
- 3. If the investigation reveals evidence to support the complaint of harassment, the harasser will be disciplined appropriately. Discipline may include suspension or dismissal, and the incident will be documented in the harasser's file. No documentation will be placed on the complainant's file, whether the complaint is upheld or not.
- 4. If the investigation fails to find evidence to support the complaint, there will be no documentation concerning the complaint placed in the file of the alleged harasser.
- 5. Regardless of the outcome of a sexual harassment complaint made in good faith, the employee lodging the complaint, as well as anyone providing information will be protected from any form of retaliation by either co-workers or superiors. This includes dismissal, demotion, unwanted transfer or denial of opportunities within the company, or harassment of an individual as a result of his/her having made a complaint or having provided evidence regarding the complaint.
- 6. Where the complaint is made in bad faith or found to be frivolous, vindictive or made for the purpose of embarrassing the alleged offender, the complainant may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination for just cause.

RESPONSIBILITY OF MANAGEMENT

It is the responsibility of the Executive Director, Artistic Director, Chair of the Board of Directors or Union Representative (CAEA Deputy) in the company to take immediate and appropriate action to report or deal with incidents of harassment of any type whether brought to their attention or personally observed. Under no circumstances should a legitimate complaint be dismissed or downplayed nor should the complainant be told to deal with it personally.

The Citadel Theatre wants to provide a safe and healthy work environment.

Harassment will not be tolerated within this organization.

ADDITIONAL RIGHTS

You have the right to contact the Alberta Human Rights Commission to file a complaint of harassment, and, if circumstances warrant it, a charge of assault may be filed with the police. A complaint must be filed with the Alberta Human Rights Commission within 12 months of the alleged incident.

MEDIA COVERAGE

Throughout the season, the Marketing Department works to maintain good relationships with the media by inviting them to review productions and by offering story ideas and interviews.

If you have personal contacts in the media, please share with the Marketing Department before
reaching out to your contact. Citadel Theatre has pre-existing relationships with different
outlets, and we follow a routine/schedule that best serves the production.

- We welcome any information about events personal or professional and pitch ideas that we can pass on to the media.
- You may be approached through Stage Management to conduct interviews with the media or be available at our media call.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photos are traditionally taken for publicity purposes during dress rehearsal. Citadel Theatre will post approved photos (or "Press Photos") online shortly after we get them from the photographer. Any images shared will be credited appropriately (i.e.: designed by, photo of, etc). A link to a "Press Photos" folder (along with credit document) will be shared through Stage Management. Due to contractual obligations, any photos posted online by Citadel Theatre or artists must be accompanied by the credits shared in the credit document.

MEDIA PACKAGES

To be environmentally friendly, the Marketing Team will provide digital versions of media clippings and reviews towards the end of the production run, upon request, by electronic transfer.

PHOTO/VIDEO CAPTURE DURING REHEARSALS AND PERFORMANCES

We love social media and showing off behind-the-scenes content for our followers. However, the use of video and photography in rehearsals and backstage is controlled through the Canadian Theatre Agreement, to which Citadel Theatre (and all artists, crew, and staff) must follow.

43:10 Capture of Material in Rehearsal or Backstage

(A) Capture During Rehearsal

Recordings made and photographs taken in rehearsal shall be allowed with notice corresponding to the declared use. However, any Artist may withdraw their consent for the recording of material at any time by informing either Stage Management or a representative of the Theatre.

(B) Capture Backstage

Specific permission to record any activities backstage including in or around dressing rooms must be requested in writing no later than twenty-four (24) hours in advance. No Artist shall be penalized in any way for refusing to grant permission for the capture of material in these areas. The only exception to this Clause is the capture of rehearsal material at a Dress Rehearsal, where the standard 24 hour notice shall apply. There shall be no capture of material during the half-hour call or in the wings during a performance. To this end, no camera or cell phones shall be permitted in the wings or on stage with the exception of those used by Stage Management for emergencies.

In short, there are some instances in which filming and photography backstage is permitted, but company-wide notice and approval must take place first. Please check in with your Stage Manager or Producer Jessie van Rijn (ivanrijn@citadeltheatre.com) if you are interested in capture of material in rehearsal or backstage during your time at Citadel Theatre.

How do these CTA clauses translate into your show and experience at the Citadel?

- The Director and Stage Manager will confirm what the policy is for rehearsals with the company
 on the first day of rehearsals, and appropriate standing notice will be shared in schedules (if
 applicable). If anyone in the rehearsal hall expresses concern about this activity to Stage
 Management or Citadel Theatre staff during the rehearsal process, rehearsal hall footage will be
 discontinued. No individual will be penalized in any way for withdrawing consent.
- Please do not bring your phones backstage (the threshold of the theatre backstage doors) during technical rehearsals unless permission is specifically granted and communicated (43:10B).

- Please do not capture any content (including in the Green Room) within the half-hour call.
- To reflect on the 24-hour request for behind-the-scenes photography stipulated in 43:10B (including wig and wardrobe area, green room, dressing room hallway and dressing rooms): Citadel will officially ask all artists and crew on each production in the week before technical rehearsals if behind-the-scenes photography may be captured on personal cellphones up until the half-hour call for the duration of technical rehearsals or performances for any given show. All staff, crew and artists will be given an opportunity to anonymously express consent or concerns to a Citadel representative. If anyone expresses concern to one of the above individuals anonymously, behind-the-scenes footage will not be allowed. No individual will be penalized in any way for refusing to grant permission.

SOCIAL MEDIA

We encourage all Artists working at the Citadel Theatre to help generate word-of-mouth buzz, awareness and excitement about the production. If you do choose to post about the show, we ask that you adhere to the following guidelines:

- Share, link, post away! Please tag Citadel Theatre social accounts so we can reshare your posts! Twitter (CitadelTheatre); Facebook (Citadel Theatre), Instagram (CitadelTheatreYEG);
- **Spoiler Alert!** Please respect the artistic integrity of the production. We ask that you do not post any images, comments or details that may compromise someone's enjoyment of a production. We also ask that you respect the work of your colleagues in all posts and credit appropriately.
- @#\$%&! Please avoid the use of swears or insensitive language when posting about the show –
 we won't be able to reshare any content that has inappropriate language.
- Rehearsal Photos: Citadel Theatre recognizes each production is unique, based on the individuals in the rehearsal hall. Some processes will allow for photos or videos to be captured in the hall, and some will not. Please respect the wishes of the Company when it is decided on the first day of rehearsal and shared by either the Director or Stage Manager.
- Please give your colleagues a heads-up and ask their permission before taking and sharing photos of them (See "Capture During Rehearsals and Performances" above). If you have an image that has the okay to share, we encourage you to send it to schmait@citadeltheatre.com or tag Citadel so we may share it as well!
- **Give credit where credit is due.** Any images shared should be credited appropriately (i.e.: designed by, photo of, etc.), especially if any design elements are included (Example: showing your wig and costume? Please tag/credit the Costume Designer!).
- Before posting to a blog/media site, please let us know. If you write a post for a media site or
 your personal blog, we would appreciate you letting us know so we can help confirm any
 details and are aware when it goes live.
- Please be kind and respectful of the process, your fellow artists and Citadel Theatre. Please
 consider posting content or comments that are positive in tone. If you have feedback that is
 sensitive in nature about a fellow artist, the show or the company, please discuss the situation
 with your Stage Manager, the Company Manager, or another representative from Citadel's
 Safe Disclosure Process.

- **Errors or omissions** if you come across misinformation (i.e.: typos, incorrect or missing crediting, etc.) in any Citadel Theatre posts, please let us know right away so we can get it fixed. We encourage you to contact us directly rather than commenting or calling out the error online. We do our best to ensure accuracy of all posts; however, there is always a human at the keyboard.

SOCIAL MEDIA TAKEOVERS

The Citadel Theatre periodically allows for artists to volunteer to host "takeovers" on our company Instagram account when there is space in our social media calendar. Artists must volunteer, and there is no compensation for the activity.

The purpose of the Social Media Takeover is to build community, promote the production and encourage audiences to attend the show you are involved in. Promotion of other personal projects is allowed (promotion of album, next projects, etc) but should be kept to a minimum.

Please keep the following things in mind when an Instagram Takeover is agreed to:

- Please post Story posts only during the window of time allowed.
- Videos on Citadel's Instagram must include captions for accessibility. Add using Caption option in Stickers (How? Click here.)
- Please be mindful of language and refrain from using any swears or insensitive/inappropriate language (our audiences online include all ages!).
- Include a link to the show ticket page by using the Link option in Stickers (How? Click here.)
- Please ask permission before filming any other company members or staff and be sure to tag them if they wish to be tagged. Do not film company members or crew unless you have consent.
- The Social Media Coordinator will answer direct messages and any other tags/notifications that come separate from the Takeover (especially during busy times when multiple events are happening during same period).
- The Social Media Coordinator may create a Story highlight on The Citadel Theatre Instagram account once the Takeover is complete.
- A temporary password will be created for the day of the Takeover. Two-factor authentication requires the Social Media Coordinator to accept the sign-in and does not allow for the password to be changed by the Artist.
- Citadel Theatre reserves the right to end the Takeover at any time and/or delete any materials
 posted by an Artist that may contain inappropriate content, language or incorrect/misleading
 information.

Tips/Ideas:

- Introduce yourself, your role or involvement, tag your personal account (to reshare content to personal account during Takeover).
- Speak on why people should come see the show what makes it unique, interesting, a mustsee.
- Use a question box, polls, or other engagement options an easy way to generate content. Video replies tend to be more engaging than pictures with text.

- With consent, involve other company members have them introduce themselves, their character, their favourite line or part of the show.
- Showing audiences how you prepare (pre-show rituals) or what you like about working at the Citadel (our building, favourite YEG spots if from out of town, etc)
- Create videos using appropriate trending audio from Instagram or TikTok.
- Create transition videos from costume to costume, or your own street clothes to costume.
- Timelapse of wig or makeup application.



EXPLORE EDMONTON

THE CITY

Edmonton is a cultural, governmental and educational centre, and is the capital city of Alberta. The current metro area population is 1,519,000 (in 2022). As of 2021, it is the 2nd largest city in Alberta and the 5th largest city in Canada. It is the fastest growing Canadian city and the youngest (a larger proportion of kids, millennials, and working-age people than the national average). The city is situated on the North Saskatchewan River, and hosts a year-round slate of festivals, reflected in the nickname "Canada's Festival City."

Expect to see vast prairie skies (that offer both glorious sunsets and earthshaking thunderstorms), a river valley full of trees, and never-ending sunshine; it truly is a stunning place to live and work.

WEATHER

Summer

Edmonton's summers are from June to August and tend to be warm and dry. During the summer Edmonton can have up to 17 hours of sunlight! (The sun rises at 5:30 a.m. and doesn't set until 10:00 p.m. most nights!)

Occasionally in July and August, you can catch a spectacular thunder and lightning storm during the evening.

Fall

In the fall, the leaves start changing colours mid-September and fall off the trees throughout October and into November, creating a beautiful tapestry of colours in the river valley. Expect crisp, cool nights with sunny days.

Winter

Winter time is the coldest time of year in Edmonton and includes snow fall as early as November and as late as March. The city becomes a winter wonderland. The majority of snow fall in the region happens from December to February. Also, in the wintertime the Aurora Borealis (Northern Lights) can be seen on a regular basis. If you are doing a show here between November and March – make sure to pack warm snow boots, a hooded parka, mitts, etc.

As a past artists have put it:

"It's not cold if you dress for it!"

"It's likely you'll be in Edmonton during the winter months and that makes one want to stay inside and not explore much outside of the Citadel neighborhood. It is worth braving the outdoors. Edmontonians are aware of how difficult the weather can be, and so they create opportunities to appreciate incredible food, winter festivals, concerts, and superb theatre. The effort you put into Edmonton will come back ten-fold."

Spring

Spring in Edmonton generally happens between April, May and into June. At this time the temperature starts to increase and the plants and flowers start to bloom around the city, and our valleys, parks and boulevards explode in greenery as the trees begin to bud.

TRANSPORTATION

Getting around Edmonton is easy! We have many options for transportation.

WAYFINDING

Edmonton works on a numbered grid system, with center of city being 100 Ave and 100 Street. Citadel Theatre is two blocks off this point and can be used as your reference to "centre." Streets to the east of this point go down in number, and go up to the west. Avenues to the south go down in number, and go up to the north. When we say "north side" or "south side," we're referring to areas that are north or south of the river. "East side" or "west side" refers to areas that are east or west of the downtown core.

Edmonton's main downtown street is called "Jasper Avenue" (101 Avenue for most of its length). You'll also see "Whyte Avenue" a lot in this guide; it is 82 Avenue and is just south of the river.

WALKING

The Citadel Theatre is accessible by foot if you are staying in the downtown core. As with any major city, stay alert and aware of your surroundings (don't be a distracted walker). **HINT: DO NOT JAYWALK. Edmonton Police are notorious for ticketing jaywalkers.

CYCLING

The City of Edmonton has recently installed <u>bike lanes</u> in many neighbourhoods that are open year-round (snow tires recommended for Nov-Mar contracts). There are exterior bike racks at Citadel – ensure you have very high-quality bike lock(s). Should you have any questions or concerns about having your bike at Citadel, please talk to the Company Manager.

PARKING

There is no way around it: parking in downtown Edmonton is expensive (but handy!).

Underground Parking

If you are working in Edmonton between November and March, an underground parkade will offer best protection from the elements. The underground parkades closest to Citadel Theatre are owned and operated by the City of Edmonton and Impark (Canada Place, North Lot). Regular daily rates in these lots are up to \$20-30 (M-F, midnight-midnight) or \$25 max (Sat/Sun, midnight to midnight). For more information on the cheapest place to park during your residency, please contact Peni Christopher (pchristopher@citadeltheatre.com). HINT Split the cost with other artists in your company and carpool.

Street Parking and Surface Lots

Street parking is extremely limited (and only available for 1-2 hours). Read the signs on city streets very carefully and follow the directions. There are a few parking spaces on the south and north side of the building, but time limits are short, and ticketing is frequent. Some street parking is free after 6:00 p.m. and all day on Sunday. There are many private parking lots (Impark, etc) within a 10-minute walk to the Citadel. These surface lots can be cheaper but may be harder to find empty spots.

BUS AND LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT (LRT) Edmonton Transit Service Website

Depending on the location of your accommodation, public transit is an excellent option. Citadel Theatre is in downtown Edmonton and next to the Churchill LRT Station and on many major bus routes. Many of our staff take public transit to work and find it an affordable and fast option for commuting. Be sure to check potential transit route options for your post-show commute, to ensure you have a safe and direct ride home.


The Citadel Theatre recognizes that working away from home when you have children can be stressful, especially when it is an infant or toddler.

West Edmonton Mall is on the tip of everyone's tongue when asked "What should I do while I'm in Edmonton?" It is North America's largest mall, with over 800 stores, 100 restaurants, North America's largest indoor waterpark, the world's largest indoor amusement park (with the largest indoor rollercoaster), AND the world's largest indoor lake (complete with pirate ship, seals and birds).

It is a favourite of past Citadel artists as a "Day Off" adventure. A 25-minute drive, or 40-minute bus ride from downtown Edmonton. HINT: Save \$\$\$ when you buy as a group—discounts for group bookings at Galaxyland Amusement Park and World Waterpark start at 15 people. (Extra hint: spend a little bit extra and book a cabana/private beach for the group at the Waterpark!)

That said, there is a TON to do that does not include "The Mall," and we encourage you to check out all the unique and exciting entertainment options that Edmonton has to offer during your time at Citadel!

GALLERIES

Art Gallery of Alberta

A must-see for visual art lovers, the Art Gallery of Alberta is itself a masterpiece of architecture as well as the diverse creative focal point of Edmonton's downtown heart. HINT: Last Thursday of the month, free 4–7pm!

Alberta Craft Gallery

The Alberta Craft Gallery has ever-changing displays that offer a wide selection of handcrafted pottery, blown and fused glass, jewellery, woodwork, fibre art, furniture, and home accessories from over 150 emerging, mid-career, and established artists.

Gallery Walk on 124 Street

Zigzag through a 12-block hub of inspiration on a gallery walk around 124 Street District near Edmonton's downtown core. Visit the Bearclaw Gallery, Bugera Matheson Gallery, Peter Robertson Gallery, Lotus Art Gallery and more!

Murals

The City of Edmonton has a growing collection of amazing largescale murals in and around the downtown area. Check out the locations of each mural via this map.

MUSEUMS & HISTORICAL

Royal Alberta Museum

The new RAM (neighbour of the Citadel) is one of the province's greatest cultural attractions and the largest museum in western Canada, as well as an integral part of Edmonton's downtown Arts District. Collections include natural history, human history, Children's Gallery, a Bug Gallery, and it has an amazing gift shop!

<u>Alberta Legislature Building</u> – the seat of Alberta's provincial politics.

Known to Edmontonians as "the Ledge," the Alberta Legislature Building is a marvel of marble pillars and carved oak, beautiful Beaux-Arts architecture, stunning grounds and innovative water features (currently being renovated). Tours available. It is also the location for many festivals, marches, protests, rallies and demonstrations in the city.

Alberta Aviation Museum

Come and explore the vintage aircraft that spurred the romance, courage and clashes that mark the last century of flight.

Neon Sign Museum

The Neon Sign Museum, the first of its kind in Canada, features a collection of functional historic signs that tell a story about Edmonton's neon past. The Museum is outdoors and is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. No admission is required.



NATURE & SCIENCE

Muttart Conservatory — The Muttart Conservatory, Edmonton's premier horticultural attraction, is nestled in the River Valley and features more than 700 species of plants in 3 climate-regulated biomes - arid, temperate and tropical - and a feature biome, located within the pyramids. (CLOSED FOR CONSTRUCTION THROUGH 2021)

100 Street Funicular - Take a quick (and free!) ride down to the River Valley for easy access.

<u>John Janzen Nature Centre</u> – Edmonton's nature centre, nestled in the River Valley. Walking trails nearby. Includes a wonderful indoor playground for those with kids.

<u>Elk Island National Park</u> – 30 min drive from downtown. See bison and elk roam in the wild! Open year-round, shuttle bus available

Northern Lights viewing — Here in Edmonton, you're in one of the country's best places for witnessing this phenomenon of nature: green and pink dancing lights form part of Edmonton's skies. Be awed by the breathtaking spectacle of the undulating heavenly mosaic of colours that dance across the skies. (Sign up for Aurora alerts here!)

<u>Telus World of Science</u> – Edmonton's centre of science and discovery. Includes an IMAX Theatre, laser shows, exploratory galleries for all ages, fascinating temporary exhibits and refurbished observatory.

<u>Edmonton Valley Zoo</u> – operated by the City of Edmonton in the heart of the River Valley, the Zoo is home to more than 350 animals and focused on conservation.

GET OUTSIDE!

Running /hiking/biking: Edmonton's River Valley boasts 160 km of maintained trails (trail maps). Looking to run stairs? We have plenty of staircases to try!

<u>Outdoor Skating</u> – Edmonton boasts over 100 outdoor skating rinks, some with skate rentals. Skating season is usually December through March, depending on the weather. <u>City operated rinks</u> tend to have warming shelters, rentals and boards, where the more plentiful <u>community league operated rinks</u> are fairly simple flooded surfaces in parks (some of these are fairly tricked out!).

<u>Snowshoeing/Cross-Country Skiing</u> – want to get out on the snow? Edmonton has plenty of options for snowshoe trails and cross-country ski trails, right in the heart of the city! Rentals available here.

<u>Disc Golf Park</u> - Located at the tail end of Edmonton's picturesque Rundle Park, the Rundle Park Disc Golf Course is one of Alberta's very best courses. It offers a challenging mix of holes featuring a variety of elevation changes, manicured tree-lined fairways and even a few water hazards all of which is framed by the mighty North Saskatchewan River.

HINTS AND TRICKS FROM PAST ARTISTS

It can be very dry in Edmonton and in our building; past artists recommend the following to take care of your voice and body while you are working at Citadel Theatre, at any time of year:

- Increase your water intake 2-3x.
- Keep a humidifier in your bedroom (Citadel Theatre has a limited number of loaners, please ask Stage Manager or Company Manager for more information). Clean it regularly to prevent mold buildup.
- Steam! Many of our artists use personal facial sauna/steamers, which can be purchased at London Drugs, Walmart, or Amazon for approx \$30. Clean it regularly.
- Wear layers. Different parts of our building can vary in temperature, especially in the winter or at change of seasons.
- Moisturize! Bring extra moisturizer (oils, creams, serums, or lotions whatever works best for you).

Much of the Citadel Theatre season takes place during winter months. **Embrace the cold** and shorter days to optimize your time in the city:

- Get outside, especially if your only outdoor time is your commute. You may feel like hunkering down (especially in winter), but getting outside for a walk in the River Valley, or through a different neighbourhood, can be restorative.
- If you are coming during the winter months, be ready for the weather. A longer parka (mid-thigh or knee length) with hood that has insulation and windproof layer is suggested. Insulated snow boots with tread, warm gloves, a toque, and scarf/neck warmer will also keep you toasty and ready to explore. Sunglasses will help protect your eyes from the glare of our ever-present sun off the snow.
